

Food for Thought

One of the first things that struck me when Pope Francis was elected was his humility. His first words to the faithful was a call to pray for him. He has always focused his attention on the poor and doesn't live in the papal apartments but rather in the Casa Sancta Marta residence beside the Vatican where he eats his meals with staff and visitors. Although he has authority, he doesn't think he is any more important to God than anyone else. The link between the First Reading and the Gospel is fairly clear this week, God doesn't take more notice of the prayers of the rich and powerful, than the prayers of the poor! The Pharisee in today's Gospel is going through the motions of communicating with God, though he has no concept of his deep need of God at all. In contrast, the tax collector at least recognises his basic dependence on God, and his need of God's forgiveness. It's this honesty that Jesus commends. The important thing is recognising our need for God and knowing that we are all equal. When we recognise our dependence on God, we will approach Him with true humility and accept His gifts of forgiveness and blessings with joy!
