The last few years have been very difficult for many people, due to the worldwide Pandemic. Anyone who has tested positive for the Corona Virus, knows what it feels like having to isolate - to be excluded from the normal everyday things that we do. Exclusion can bring a sense of loneliness and isolation. Thankfully for many it's only been short term. In today's Gospel we see once again Jesus' attitude to those who were permanently excluded from society. May we always remember that there is great power in saying thank you - to God and to our fellow brothers and sisters.
