Food for Thought

We live in a world where we see death all around us... people dying in acts of murder, abortion, hunger, and as we have recently seen the war in Ukraine, earthquakes, and famine. We all must face death - it's a reality of life on earth. Today's Gospel recounts one of the most dramatic stories from the life of Jesus - the raising of Lazarus from the dead and Jesus' power to conquer death.
