It's very easy to get on with people we like. If our friends need our help, we are glad to be able to lend a hand - offer a listening ear - share our time, or give some useful advice. In contrast, we are not guite so kind to the people we dislike or to those who have hurt us. We all have small hurts and have ways of dealing with them, but the big hurts and wounds that don't heal fast take longer, and, in some cases, the scars can last a lifetime. Today's Gospel is quite a tough one, because we like to get our own back if we have been hurt. Yet, Jesus tells us that the only way forward is forgiveness and love. Loving those who have hurt us, means first and foremost forgiving them - after all, God loves the very ones that ignore, reject, and scorn Him! Love and forgiveness can overcome hatred - by transforming it. If we don't forgive, we are not free, because forgiveness is freedom. It's often easier to create division than it is to create unity. It can be very easy to join in gossip, or be critical of others, rather than to see the good in them. As we listen to the Word of God today, we ask Him to give us the courage, faith, and hope to embrace this Gospel and live it here and now, in this community of faith. Let suffering soften rather than harden our souls, so that we truly become God's temple, showing that the Spirit of God is alive and active in us, helping us to follow the Lord's example of compassion and love. Praise Him!!
