REFLECTION

The Gospel story, told by Mark, tells us the story of Jesus, the just man, of his life journey and his arrest, unjust condemnation and death on a cross. Today we hear that story told again and we witness the injustice of it, the unfairness of it and the cruelty of it. The man who lived in the light is arrested in the dark. The man who spoke openly sees his words twisted and used against him. The man who honoured every person he met is brutally treated and taken out to die. There is a powerful witness to all this. A centurion, a Roman soldier charged with executing the orders of the governor, Pilate, and overseeing the legal execution of this man, Jesus. He watches as his junior soldiers have their fun with the prisoner, mocking him and abusing him. He leads the procession through the streets of Jerusalem and observes the demeanour of this unfortunate man. At the place of execution he organizes the process and forms the guard to contain the proceedings, and then he stands there and watches this man slowly die. But as the sky darkens and the taunts of the crowd grow weaker, this Roman officer begins to realize that the man whose death he is charged to oversee is not any ordinary man. Though cruelly tormented and about to lose his life, the man on the cross is more alive than any person ever was. When he finally breathes his last breath, the soldier is forced to cry out, "In truth this man was a Son of God."

We tell this story and continue to tell it because it is the story of every person in this world. It is the story of the just person who seeks to live an honourable life, who meets with suffering and with cruelty, with injustices in a flawed society. It is the story of how the just person perseveres in goodness despite any setbacks and opposition, and seeks the face of God. This is how life is in a fallen world. The forces of darkness are very real. The darkened sky over Calvary, where Jesus died, tells us to prepare ourselves for difficult times, and the way Christ died teaches us how to live our daily lives today. Jesus did not resign himself to being taken and put to death. He took a dark situation and faced it and remained true to his father's will to the very end. The centurion witnessed the power of a truly good man. Now in our turn, by the Lord's grace, we too follow the way of the crucified one. So that people today may look at us and say, "In truth this person is truly a child of God."

LENTEN ALMS

At the Archbishop's request this year's Lenten Alms are being donated to Asylum Link, which is an organisation dedicated to assisting Asylum Seekers and Refugees in Liverpool and to raising public awareness around refugee issues. It is a welcoming and safe place for people from all countries to meet, relax and find out about the city they have arrived in. Asylum Link provides friendship, help and advice and encourages the participation of asylum seekers and refugees in the service. Most services are provided on a drop-in basis, with appointments available for specialist activities. Every day, tea, coffee and biscuits are available during opening hours and lunch is served most days to everyone. The day to day running of the centre is managed by four full time and three part time staff, and over 100 volunteers.

Mass on Easter Sunday morning is the most joyful celebration in the Church's year as we rejoice in the fact that Jesus Christ has risen from the dead. The Church does not insist that we attend all the services in Holy Week but there can be great personal and shared spiritual reward in taking part in as many of them as we are able to. Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday and is the last week in Lent. It ends with the three day triduum of Holy Thursday when we specially celebrate the Last Supper during evening Mass, Good Friday when, in the afternoon, we solemnly commemorate the Crucifixion of Christ and Holy Saturday when the Easter Vigil Mass begins as daylight fades.

This year, in our parish, the triduum will be celebrated at Saint Joseph's church on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. In addition there will be parallel services at Sacred Heart church on Thursday and Friday and at Twelve Apostles on Holy Saturday.
