## Gospel Reflection

Lighthouses can be incredible structures, and they come in many different shapes and sizes. The tallest in the world is claimed to be the Jeddah Light in Saudi Arabia, which stands at the entrance to Jeddah's Harbour on the Red Sea. This lighthouse is a very modern design. Built in 1990, it is a far cry from the more traditional structures that we are familiar with. Constructed from concrete and steel, it has a wide triangular base, which leads into the main vertical section. This, in turn, leads to a large, bulbous head, where the lamp is to be found along with a viewing balcony. Most importantly, it emits three white flashes every twenty seconds. Lighthouses are often built in or close to inhospitable places. There is something enigmatic about them. They are there as immovable objects in places of danger and they share one thing in common – they shine their light and save lives. Whether it's the Red Sea, the Atlantic Ocean or the English Channel, lighthouses all have one job, which is to be an unfailing beacon and a sign of hope to the traveler on the waves. They may all have their own architectural style and their special paint job, but at the end of the day they shine brightly and can be seen for miles.

There is a great clarity in Jesus' teaching throughout the Gospel about the need to be witnesses: to be bearers of the light. Jesus calls his followers to proudly stand up and be bold in sharing the new life that they find in him. To know Jesus is to be living in the light, and this light cannot be hidden. The message that Jesus shares is clear. He wants us to make our faith visible through loving service to others. These good works, which followers of Jesus should naturally want to do, will be a beacon of light and hope to those around us. Today's Gospel Reading is preceded in Matthew by the Beatitudes, Jesus' revolutionary teaching about how we are called to see ourselves in the way that God sees us. Jesus shows that those who, in the eyes of the world, live in darkness are in fact those who are truly blessed. These are the ones who share in the sufferings of Christ. These are the ones who have the light. This light is a light to be shared so that safe harbor may be found by all.

Just as lighthouses are very different in appearance, so are we. We all have unique gifts and talents. We all have our own way of interacting with each other and the world around us. As Christians, though, what we share in common is the Gospel and its central message of love, especially God's love for each one of us. Baptized into Christ, and with the Holy Spirit in us, we are called to share God's love as we grow in holiness according to our vocation. This vocation – whether it be through marriage, the single life, religious life – is our way in which we share the light of the Gospel. It is our way of being light. If we, as Parish families, live out our faith to the full, then our place of worship can become a lighthouse, spreading grace into the local community. Through prayer we can become a light for God. When we share this light through our love and our works of charity, we do so because together we become the Body of Christ. We may all be different but we are enlightened by the same source and shine forth our witness to that same source – Jesus the one true light.
