and All Saints Golborne Parish of St. Lewis Croft One theme runs through all three of the readings this weekend. It is a very important and comforting theme. It is at the very heart of the Good News. The theme is "We are loved in our sins." We see this in the First Reading from the Book of Exodus. In spite of the ingratitude and grumblings of the people, God doesn't write them off or reject them. Instead he shows his love for them by providing water for them in the desert as they journey to the Promised Land. The same message is explicitly stated in the Second Reading when Paul writes, "What proves that God loves us is that Christ Jesus died for us while we were still sinners." And we see this message in action in the Gospel when Jesus approaches the woman at the well. Jesus' approach to the outcast woman was so very gentle. He didn't force himself into her life. Had he done so she may well have rejected any conversation with him. In fact, Jesus began from a position of weakness. He began with a request for a drink of water. In this way he disposed her to receive the gift he wanted to give her. His heart was already open to her. Now she opened her heart up to him. A wonderful dialogue and a marvellous exchange took place.

He treated her with great respect. Not a hint of judgement or condemnation. Right from the start he was looking into her heart, yet he did not make her feel bad. She didn't feel judged. Rather, she felt accepted and understood. No one ever paid such close and loving attention to her before. Jesus explained her life to her more sympathetically than she had ever been able to explain it to herself. Before she realized it, she had shared with him the whole story of her sad and confused life. Jesus was able to see into her secret being, into that part of her which longed for true love, which was pure and innocent, thirsting to be seen as a person and not as an object. She was a deeply wounded woman, wounded by a series of broken relationships.

As with the Samaritan woman, so with us, Jesus meets us where we are. He says to us what he said to the lost woman at the well: "If you only knew the gift God wants to give to you." We can at times find it very difficult to admit our poverty, weakness and sins. Hence we are then unable to receive the "gift of God" Jesus wishes to give us. God doesn't love us because we are trying to be perfect. He loves us and accepts us precisely because we are sinners. Only the person who has experienced this kind of love can truly know what it is. As we think about the woman at the well in the Gospel Reading this weekend, let us pray that we can be more like her in opening our hearts up to God and to all the gifts he wants to share with us.

CORONAVIRUS

Updated information from the Archbishop and Trustees of the Archdiocese - 10th March

- The sign of peace is to be suspended at Mass. In order not to create confusion in the minds of the lay faithful, all priests should simply omit any reference to the offering of the sign of peace, prior to the Agnus Dei.
- Holy Communion from the chalice shall cease to be offered to the lay faithful. The practice of intinction is not to be introduced as an alternative. Priest concelebrants however may receive communion by intinction.
- When giving communion in the hand seek to ensure you place the host in the hand of the recipient in such a way that you do not touch their hands.
- The faithful should be encouraged to receive the sacred host in the hand rather than on the tongue. Their doing this represents an act of loving charity to their community.
- Holy water stoups in churches and chapels are to be emptied.
- Churches and chapels that are open daily for private prayer should continue to remain open. Care should be given to ensuring that surfaces of high contact (e.g. light switches, door handles and areas around the door) are regularly sanitised throughout the day. Ideally door handles should be cleaned before and after every Mass.
- Priests/deacons should wash and sanitise their hands before Mass. All ministers should discreetly wash and sanitise their hands before and after distributing Holy Communion. Shared towels should not be used in toilet areas or the sacristy.
- Shared hymnbooks and Mass books should cease to be used. Single-use Mass sheets may be used, though these should be disposed of immediately after use.
- Ask everyone attending Mass to sanitise their hands as they come into church using sanitised gel dispensers, assuming they are available. These should be placed in porches or entrances.
- Do not pass the collection plate around; alternative methods for the collection should be sought.
- Suspend catering (teas, coffees etc) at large parish gatherings where multiple people touch mugs, utensils, biscuits etc.
- Ask anyone with cold or flu symptoms to refrain from attending liturgy or other public events and to not attend the sacrament of reconciliation if symptomatic. They may have an ordinary cold but equally it is important to ensure a precautionary approach.
- Advise those most vulnerable to refrain from large parish gatherings and stay at home.
