

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The prophet Isaiah understands how important names are to people. This is why, in today's First Reading, he attempts to give hope to the despondent people of Israel by saying: "you will be called by a new name, no longer are you to be named "Forsaken", nor your land "Abandoned", but you shall be called "My Delight" and your land "The Wedded"." The Good News is that the people of Israel are not going to be stuck with their old name "Forsaken", for there is going to be a wedding. And just as the bride changes her name in the wedding, so the people of Israel are going to get a brand new name. Isaiah promises that the time will come when God will take his people to himself like a bridegroom takes his new bride, and there will be great rejoicing in this new relationship. So it is that Israel waits for the day and the hour when this great event will take place. They wait for their wedding day, their meeting place with God.

Today's Gospel Reading shows us that the wedding is on. At the festival of a Jewish Wedding in Cana, Jesus reveals his glory through his first great sign. It's an unusual wedding for there are two bridegrooms! There is the bridegroom who has just got married, and there is Jesus who is the real bridegroom. He is an invited guest at the wedding, but Jesus is also the long-awaited bridegroom of Israel. Jesus will transform this private Jewish wedding into a great sign to show that the time has come when God will take his people to himself in a new way. Jesus has come as the bridegroom to claim his bride, Israel.

During the wedding feast, the wine runs out and Mary expects Jesus to do something about it. Jesus' negative answer to Mary underlines the point that he cannot be bound by family relationships, but only by his Father's will. There are six large stone jars used to provide water for the Jewish rituals of cleansing. Jesus tells the servants to fill these jars to the brim, and after they do this they discover that the water had been changed into wine - all 120 gallons of it! When the steward tastes it, he compliments the bridegroom for keeping the best wine until last – but he is complimenting the wrong bridegroom! Jesus is the one who has supplied the new wine and in doing so has revealed his glory. When the disciples see what has happened they believe in Jesus.

The story gives us a marvellous image of the loving relationship we have with God through Jesus. It is also says something to us of the power of Mary's intercession and prayer. Jesus has come to claim us as God's own, and he is generous in the gifts he brings. The symbolism of the wedding feast appears through the Gospels. In John's account of the Marriage Feast of Cana, Jesus is so generous in the amount and quality of the gift of wine he provides, thus allowing the feast and the celebration to continue even longer. Luke shares the same point in his Gospel: "Can the wedding guests fast while the bridegroom is still with them?" Because Jesus, the Son of God, is with them, it is not the time to fast but the time to feast. And the feast is generous: "out of his fullness have we all received" (John 1:16).

The ultimate generosity of Jesus is shown when he dies out of love for us, when the bridegroom lays down his life for the bride. Jesus gives his whole self in love. He gives us his Body and Blood in the Eucharist so that we can be united with him and with God the Father. So let us rejoice today that God invites us to the wedding feast, a celebration that will have no end.
