GOSPEL REFLECTION

Every year, on this Sunday, the Church reads an account of the Passion of Jesus. As we listen to it, we are reminded of the cowardice of the followers who abandon Jesus in his hour of need. We think

of the wickedness of the religious leaders who plotted his death, and remember the cruelty of the soldiers who carried out his execution. And we do need to be reminded of these things, because, whether we like it or not, such cruelty and wickedness continues to exist throughout the world today, and the poor and most vulnerable are often still victimised and rejected by large sections of society. But this is not necessarily the main purpose of the Passion reading. The main emphasis is on Jesus, the central character in the story. What we are remembering is the fidelity, the courage, and the sheer goodness of Jesus. Against the darkness of Calvary, his goodness shines all the more brightly. The

day of his death is not called "Bad Friday" but "Good Friday". What makes it good is the love of Jesus – "Greater love has no man than to lay down his life for his friends." It is this great love that we are remembering during Holy Week. The early Christians saw in the passion and death of Jesus the triumph of failure. On the surface, it seemed like a defeat for Jesus, but it was a victory. It took the early Christians many years to understand this fully. It was the triumph of good over evil, of love over hate, of light over darkness, of life over death.

The Passion story shows how Jesus responded to what was done to him. He absorbed all the violence, transformed it and returned it as love and forgiveness. This was the victory of love over all the powers of destruction. There was nothing but love in him. Even when they nailed his hands and feet to the cross, he forgave those who executed him. It helps to think about that when we are going through hard times. It is a consolation for us to know that Jesus suffered in his life here on earth. It can give some meaning to the suffering that we sometimes go through ourselves. Yet Jesus' suffering would have been a waste of time if he had not endured it with love. It was not Jesus' suffering that saved the world, but his LOVE.

As we remembering the Passion of Jesus today, let us put ourselves in the story. Where would we be? Which character from the Passion story really reminds us of ourselves? Does the story make us want to stand up for the rights of those who suffer today? Hopefully, the story of Jesus' Passion will remind us of God's great love for us, a love that challenges us to love others even more.
