

## **Archdiocesan Mission Statement**



Taking to heart the last words of the Lord Jesus, we will go into the world to proclaim the Good News to the whole of creation.

#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

This week, we saw the Inauguration of President Obama for his second term of office. It is quite an historic occasion, one which holds a great deal of hope for many Americans and other people throughout the world. Whether we like it or not, the USA is a very important country in world politics and therefore, its leader, the US president, is perhaps one of the most important and powerful people in the world. During his speech, the President outlined his main policies and hopes for the future. In today's Gospel, Jesus did something similar at the beginning of his ministry. In the synagogue, at Nazareth, he read a passage from Isaiah which summed up his mission. He announced that the long-awaited "Day of the Lord" had come at last, and that it would be a day of favour for everyone, especially for the poor and the oppressed.

The following story is similar to some of the stories that Jesus told during his ministry. Once there was a landlord whose tenants fell into arrears with the rent. Very soon they found themselves entangled in a web of squalor and debt. They saw no way out of their predicament. The landlord was a kind and gentle man. Even so, the tenants wondered just how much time he would give them to pay the rent. Then a new bailiff appeared on the scene and began to make his rounds. During his rounds, the bailiff asked how much everyone owed. But, surprisingly, he didn't leave it at that. He visited their homes, he asked about the old, the sick and the disabled. He got to know their worries and their problems. Then, one day, he called them all together. They gathered in fear and trepidation, convinced that the dreadful day of reckoning had arrived. He began his speech by telling them off for getting in a debt they could not possibly pay back, and that the landlord should have no option but to evict them from their homes. This is what the tenants expected him to say. Then he said, "I have good news. The landlord has asked me to tell you that you can forget about all your debts. He is wiping the slate clean. From this day, you can start all over again." There was much rejoicing over such good news.

Such was the Good News announced by Jesus in the Synagogue at Nazareth. He was the new bailiff sent by God to his debt-ridden people. According to the Pharisees, the Day of the Lord would be a day of judgement - and here was Jesus declaring that it was the day of the Lord's favour, not just for those who deserved it, but for everyone. The Lord's favour is not limited to a particular day. It can be given to us on any day. The Good News is that salvation is not achieved through our own merits, but through the goodness of God. This is the heart of the Good News. The only thing to be done is to open our hearts to the Saviour who has come to bring us salvation and joy. Jesus didn't merely announce the Good News and leave it at that, he began to make it a reality in the lives of the people he encountered. God wants us to live out the Gospel message in Word and in Deed. The falseness of the Pharisees lay in the fact that they did not practice what they preached. Ghandi once said, "My life is my message." And so it was with Jesus. And so it could be with us.

**Psalm Response Gospel Acclamation**  Your words are spirit, Lord, and they are life. The Lord has sent me to bring Good News to the poor, to proclaim liberty to the captives.
