

GOSPEL REFLECTION

One night, a wealthy man had a disturbing dream. In the dream, he saw a crowd of poor, diseaseridden, starving people crying out to him for help. When he woke up the following morning, remembering his dream, he decided to embark on a crusade of good. He wasted no time. He set out in his Mercedes that very morning to see what needed to be done. He had only just passed through the gates of his mansions when he saw a beggar sitting on the ground, his hand stretched out imploringly. The rich man was very upset on seeing the poor man's wretched condition. He hesitated for a moment, and then ordered his chauffeur to step on the accelerator. He couldn't afford to stop to help one man when, he thought, so many more needed his help. He travelled the length and breadth of the city. He discovered that the problems were vast and the needs great. As he returned home in the evening, his mind was overflowing with plans, schemes and projects. The only problem was where to begin. Should he begin with a hospital, a school, a factory, a prison? He did not know. As he came to the gate of his mansion, he noticed that the beggar was still lying at the side of the road. "Just imagine", he thought to himself, "that poor man has been sitting at the side of the road all day in all this heat". Once again a wave of pity and compassion passed over him; but once again he passed by. That night he had another dream. Again he heard the cries for help, except this time they were not coming from lots of people, but from only one person. This person was the beggar sitting on the ground outside his mansion. So the next morning he knew exactly where to start in making a difference to people's lives. He started with the beggar man.

Like the rich man in today's Gospel, we so often carry on with our lives without seeing the needs of others. The rich man in the story above could not have been expected to save the world, but at least he realised he could make a difference to at least one life - the life of the poor man on the side of the road. God does not expect us to change the world either, but we can still make a difference to the lives of those around us. This is the challenge of today's Gospel. What are we going to do about it?
