#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

A vineyard is a very special place, normally reserved for vines only. Yet, in his parable, Jesus talks about a fig tree which was planted in a vineyard. At that time, this was not so unusual. Good soil was so scarce that trees were planted wherever they could grow. We are dealing then with a tree planted in a very privileged place. In the normal course of events, it takes three years for a fig tree to reach maturity. If, by that time, it is not bearing fruit, it is likely that it will never ever bear fruit at all. Such was the case with the tree Jesus was talking about. For three years the owner had been coming to it and found it barren. He came to the conclusion that the tree was useless. It was drawing nourishment from the ground, but giving nothing back. It had to go - it was taking up valuable space. So he told the gardener to get rid of it. But the gardener, who had great knowledge of fig trees, replied, "Sir, give it one more year. I'll dig the earth around it and put on plenty of dung. Then, if there are no figs on it this time next year, we'll cut it down." The owner of the vineyard agreed. We are not told what happened to the fig tree. In a sense, this doesn't matter because Jesus had made his point. Just as the gardener was patient with the fig tree, so God is patient with sinners.

This Gospel passage has sometimes been called the "Gospel of the Second Chance". God is patient with his people. The history of the Church is full of stories of barren fig trees that in time become fruitful. In other words, there are stories of many sinners who become saints. Moses, at the centre of today's First Reading, is a good example. In his younger days, he actually killed another man. Yet God did not write him off. It is true that he had a fiery temper, but there was good in him. He was that rare being – the kind of man who couldn't stand idly by when he saw injustice or crime taking place. It was because of this inner quality that God chose him to lead his people from slavery to freedom. Some people develop slowly, or turn to God later in life. What such people need is someone to believe in them, someone who will have patience with them. The parable of the fig tree should remind us that there is always a second chance with God, for he believes in each one of us more than anyone else.

### ARCHBISHOP PATRICK KELLY RETIRES

On Wednesday, it was announced in Rome that Pope Benedict had accepted the resignation of the

Most Reverend Patrick Kelly as Archbishop of Liverpool and Metropolitan of the Northern Province. This decision takes effect immediately. Archbishop Kelly made his request to the Holy Father in January because of the stroke he experienced in December. The Archbishop said: "Last Sunday, in a letter read at all Masses, I reflected on the retirement of the Holy Father and my own. I recalled the thanksgiving in which many shared on the occasion of my Golden Jubilee as a priest on 18th February 2012. All that remains to be said will find its place (...) in the great annual diocesan celebration called the Mass of Chrism in the Cathedral on the Wednesday



of Holy Week, 27th March, at 7.30 pm." Bishop Tom Williams has been appointed Apostolic Administrator of the Archdiocese of Liverpool to ensure that necessary oversight and pastoral leadership are maintained until a new Archbishop is appointed.

### **BENEDICT XVI**

PONTIFICATE · APR 2005 - FEB 2013

"I am a pilgrim who is beginning the last part of his pilgrimage on earth...

"But with all my interior strength, with all my heart, with all my love I will work for the good of the Church and all humanity"

This week, Pope Benedict retired after eight years as Bishop of Rome and Supreme Pontiff of the Holy Roman Church. He left the Vatican on Thursday evening and travelled to the Papal Summer Residence in the tiny hill-top town of Castel Gandolfo, where he will remain until his new home is ready in Vatican City.

In his final address, he said: "Thank you, thank you from my heart... You know that today is different from others, as of 8.00 pm I will no longer be the Supreme Pontiff of the Holy Roman Church. I am a pilgrim who is beginning the last part of his pilgrimage on earth. But with all my interior strength, with all my heart, with all my love I will work for the good of the Church and all humanity". And, in a final tweet, he wrote: "Thank you for your love and support. May you always experience the joy that comes from putting Christ at the centre of your lives."

Let us pray for both Pope Benedict and Archbishop Kelly: that they may enjoy their retirement with good health, a lot of peace, and joy in the Lord.
