

Taking to heart the last words of the Lord Jesus, we will go into the world to proclaim the Good News to the whole of creation.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

There is a tendency among religious people to think that God owes them something. They imagine God as an employer. If we do the work, then in justice our employer owes us our wages. God owes us a reward in Heaven provided we serve him faithfully here on earth. This is a very understandable attitude. But it introduces a mercenary attitude towards something that should be a loving relationship between ourselves and God. It is also completely opposed to the Gospel message. The truth is that we can NEVER put God in a position where he is in debt to us. Jesus says that even when we have done all we are expected to do – and who among us could be so bold as to make that claim – we still cannot make demands on God.

At the time of Jesus, Judaism was dominated by the idea of merit – much like the new translation of the Roman Missal today! Jesus was challenging that attitude. Our faith in Christ is a religion of grace and NOT of merit. Salvation CANNOT be earned. We can never put God in our debt. But the Good News is that we don't have to. God is our Father, we are his children. He blesses us and helps us because we are his children and because we need him.

It should come as a great relief to us to discover that we don't have to prove ourselves to God. He loves us despite our sinfulness, despite our wrongdoing. We don't have to earn God's love. It would be impossible to do so even if we tried. God loved us long before we could have done anything to deserve it. And he loves us even when we are sinners. Our task is to return his love and share this love with others. We don't keep the commandments so that God will love us. We keep the commandments BECAUSE God loves us. He wants us to serve him out of love, NOT out of a sense of duty. Therefore, faith alone is not enough. We need love too.

What God wants from us is that we should come to him as children come to their father. He wants us to live out his commandment of love, not out of the hope of receiving a reward, but out of love for him and for others. If we do this then perhaps we can make the world a better place.
